Assertions in "Anatomy"

- Rising epidemic
 - Psychiatry disorders
 - Disability due to psychiatric disorders
- Psychopharmacology harmful.
 - Causes epidemic of disorders and disability
 - Makes patients worse
- No biological basis for psychiatry
- No evidence for chemical imbalance


Rising Epidemic

Assertion: "Astonishing Rise of Mental Illness in America" caused by increased rates of treatment

Refutation:


- No increase in incidence or prevalence
- Inconsistent with epidemiological data
- No evidence of causality
- Conclusion: Assertion False

Rising Disability

- Assertion: Psychiatric disability increasing and caused by psychiatric medication
- Refutation:
 - Disability rates stable
 - Disability status easier to obtain over time
 - Changes with rules and funding (ADA)
 - No evidence of cause and effect with meds
- Conclusion: Assertion False


Whitaker falsely equates hospitalization rates years ago with disability rates today.

Disability Definition



Overall Disability Rates: All Causes


